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Dear Members of the Queensland Sentencing Advisory Council,

I am writing as a concerned member of the public to express deep concern regarding the sentencing outcomes in a case involving persistent breaches of bail and ongoing abuse toward their victim.

I am particularly concerned about the case of [REDACTED] who is soon to face sentencing. Reports indicate that he has breached bail conditions on **five separate occasions** — each breach being an opportunity used not for rehabilitation, but to further harass, intimidate, and abuse his victim. This pattern of behaviour raises critical questions about the effectiveness of current sentencing practices in deterring repeat offending and in safeguarding victim safety. [REDACTED]

It is deeply troubling that repeated violations of bail conditions, which are designed to protect victims and uphold the integrity of the justice system, often result in minimal consequences. Such outcomes send a dangerous message — that perpetrators can continually undermine court orders without facing meaningful accountability. More importantly, the frequent bail and bail breaching meant his victim, [REDACTED] had little to no chance of escaping him.

I respectfully urge the Council to consider recommending legislative and policy changes that allow for:

1. Stronger sentencing for offenders who breach bail multiple times, particularly where it involves contact with or harm to the victim.
2. Cumulative sentencing for repeated breaches and abuse, instead of concurrent terms.
3. Greater weight given to patterns of behaviour in sentencing decisions, not just individual offences.

Justice must not only address the letter of the law but also the lived experiences of victims who face continuous fear and trauma. When the justice system fails to respond firmly to repeat offenders, it places victims at continued risk and erodes public trust in legal protections.

I appreciate the vital work the Council does in reviewing and advising on sentencing matters, and I hope this issue can be taken into consideration as part of your ongoing efforts to ensure sentencing in Queensland is fair, effective, and protective of those most vulnerable. Let's set a new precedent in sentencing for repeat domestic violence offenders in Queensland.
