

With a lot to say in 1 document it leaves me no space to word the harsh reality of the truth so that those who read this are more comfortable.

When everyone goes home after the day has ended this truth is ours.

This truth is ██████ who was a victim of DFV as a child and as an adult. She was raped by a family member and beaten, into adulthood she was the victim again of DFV by the hands of her previous partner now aged in her 40s the impacts of DFV still remain.

██████ a victim of DFV he lashes out at authority because while he was beaten as a child in a DFV environment he was sent away to boys homes where he suffered more abuse from those who were meant to protect, he suffered physical and sexual abuse, now in his mid 40's he still struggles with the trauma that the right to his body was taken from him, his abuse in and out of the system has turned him into a product of DFV and the system and now at his age the trauma and unseen scars from the abuse are unleashed on the public with each crim spree to support a drug habit fueled by self hate from the trauma of DFV and the systematic abuse.

██████ who is currently imprisoned but was a child victim of DFV including physical and sexual abuse at the hands of his mother, her partner and the boys homes where he was meant to be safe, he knows no other life but the life behind bars, now in his late 30s the law frowns and says he should know better, how and who was meant to teach him.

The authorities and safe people only added to the abuse, his story is very similar to ██████'s above.

██████ who had no history as a child of being raised in DFV but became the victim of an abusive person, he sexually assaulted ██████ and her oldest daughter, now aged in her 60s she struggles to breathe because of the damage the beatings did to her lungs. ██████ looks in the mirror and one eye is smaller than the other because it doesn't open all the way due to the numerous times her eye sockets, cheekbones and nose were fractured, while ██████ was a victim of childhood rape it would not fall under the DFV category for charges.

██████ a victim of childhood sexual assault and a victim of DFV struggled through out her life with trauma due to the abuse, as an aboriginal woman she faced more hardship then most now in her 40s she received her first criminal charge not long after her 40th birthday, her husband who is imprisoned currently and in his 60s was also a victim of childhood trauma related to DFV. They ended up with a criminal history because times were hard and with a large family to provide for they turned to what they knew as children to earn a living and that was selling illegal substances to pay the power bill, to make their home a home, to throw birthday parties for the grandchildren, when i asked ██████ how DFV affected her life her response was short " it still does "...

██████ who is in her mid 20s now was a victim of sexual assault in a DFV setting only a few years ago, ██████ has 2 children of her own and because the trauma that is left with her due to the sexual assault as well as the violence of DFV she is over protective and vigilant in her day to day life with the children, unable to enjoy life to the fullest because she remains in a constant heightened state to protect her children so that they do not go through or see anything that she went through.

██████ is now in his mid 20s he is the victim of DFV from the time he was born, he witnessed more violence and was the victim of more beatings then most, the rapes and beatings of his mother, the sexual assault of his little sister, the sexual assault of his partner at the hands of his stepfather, ██████ now faces a term of imprisonment looming over his head because when times got tough and he lost his job he turned to and illegal income involving drugs. ██████ does not use his trauma as an excuse and he takes responsibility for his crimes however his

attitude towards authority figures stem from the trauma as a child when on repeated occasions his cries for help were ignored.

██████████ who was a victim of DFV and sexual assault at the hands of her mother and mothers friends she has lived a hard life,as have all the survivors I mention. ██████████ father may he rest in peace and his family the only people who helped shelter her as a child because of the stigma surrounding DFV that only men commit these crimes, now in her 40s she still suffers victim blaming tactics from her mother and younger siblings where they isolate and run constant smear campaigns, currently in a wheel chair her health is terrible and with little support from agencies but none from her family she relies on the help of 3 of her daughters.

██████████ although the same name but no relation is in her early 20s she was a victim of DFV and childhood sexual assault under the definition of a DFV crime as the above victims she was placed in to the care of child safety where she further endured sexual assault, she turned to drugs to cope, has been to prison and whilst now free she gave birth to her first child whom was removed by child safety because at the time ██████████ was in a DFV relationship, little support is offered for ██████████ and her baby to be reunited although she has done a lot of hard work they can not be together until ██████████ has a home of her own, an extremely hard task given the rental market today.

██████████ who is a victim of DFV and childhood sexual assault, currently under the care of child safety and resides in a "resi home" had her trial discontinued because the prosecutor believed her mental health couldnt cope. This ██████████ strongly disagrees with, she can cope with telling her story but what she can not do is sit for hours waiting on a judge to be ready, waiting on her abuser to be ready, waiting on her abusers legal team to be ready. Her trauma replays in her head in the idle time she sits and waits. ██████████ often rage's resulting in police intervention because when the impact of the trauma becomes to much she explains it has a fire in her brain that burns and rages until she explodes, once she releases the rage she then sleeps, something she is not able to do often because her abuser came through the night while she was sleeping.

Nadia aka myself a victim of childhood sexual assault and DFV, as an adult a victim of DFV and sexual assault with DFV as an aggravating factor, in my late 30s at the time I write this nothing has changed despite longer sentencing, despite people being made more aware because by the statistics on the most recent page according to sentencing etc the indecent treatment of a child under 16 has the lowest percentage of imprisonment .

Whilst robbery is the highest.

Yet the childhood abuse both the sexual and the violence that comes hand in hand, is what causes the ripple effect, the myth of a pedophile. I use the term pedophile because that's what these men and women are, only having 1 victim is a lie. It is a disgusting lie and I do not wish to even locate its origin. I often hear through the courts and the people that a pedophile is easier to rehabilitate than a "junkie" and they do less damage because they only have 1 victim.

Read above, read the brief sentences about our lives that have been marred with trauma and sexual assault it causes 2nd and 3rd hand victims, the community bares the cost of what little services are available and the prison system incarcerates victims who have been unable to seek help, even when that help is available now and with so much more awareness those services are underfunded and exhausted so more money is drawn from the community to help. The people who were victims and chose crime created more victims but the fact still remains that it all stemmed from DFV crimes. The abuser walks free and

moves on to more victims creating the cycle over and over again, to end the cycle the route of the problem has to be solved.

The root of the problem is DFV and i bluntly say

“ROB ME, TAKE MY CAR, TAKE MY MONEY, TAKE MY BELONGINGS. DO NOT TAKE AWAY MY RIGHT TO SAY NO TO MY BODY, DO NOT TAKE AWAY MY CHILDREN'S RIGHTS. DO NOT BEAT ME, DO NOT BEAT MY CHILDREN,DO NOT RAPE MY CHILDREN”

OUR BODIES AND OUR BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS ARE PRICELESS AND NON NEGOTIABLE

When I leave this world I can not take nothing with me but my body and that to me and every other victim is the most priceless and valuable belonging we own, within my body i grew my children, the fact that the crime of robbery has one of the highest percentages for terms of imprisonment was the most disgusting fact that I as a victim and now a survivor have ever read. We do not scream our stories on the news or in the paper because we used to feel shame but the times are changing and the guilt to bare now we hand to the abusers, it is their shame to bare and we will scream our stories from every rooftop and billboard, we will walk the streets and tell our stories the fact that because our stories make most people uncomfortable, hearing how I was chained up by my neck and stabbed , raped and beaten, or the time i was strangled with an extension lead and forced to give oral sex to my abuser. Or the time i was beaten with a baseball bat in the middle of the street while I coward over my 6 week old baby to protect him from each blow, then the police arrive I was covered in blood my head split in multiple places, my newborn baby bruised from the blows i couldnt shield and i was asked what happened by the police in front if my abuser.. These stories are not ancient, they are as recent as 2021 they make people see the dark side of humanity and in 2025 it still happens regularly.

Change and urgent change is what is needed

“REHABILITATE THE JUNKIES AND THIEVES IN OUR COMMUNITY,SAVE THE PRISON CELLS FOR THE ABUSERS AND THE RAPISTS, THE WORST OF THE WORST”

After all they are ththroat of the problem.

While I dont believe prison is a sustainable solution as it is the biggest financial drain on our society and the system is responsible for a lot of the current crime, the men and women in their late 30s and early 40s are the products of the system abuse and the ones who slipped through the cracks before the laws started to change and with it still ongoing another redress scheme will be sceduled to roll out in another decade give or take, the community come together and the peoples voices are louder together then that of the individual. All of that money could be used to solve the core of the problem.

We are told that the news prints many fabricated details yet most of the time the laws change when the public starts to cry out on the news or when a tragedy takes place and those who are not in our community with the victims day in and day out then take notice. I wake up every day and I live my life as though its the last day because i have been beaten, raped, stabbed, assaulted on a daily basis since I was born.

My daughter was raped from age 7 to age 12

My daughter in law was sexually assaulted

All by the same man

He robbed us as well of material possessions but none of that sits with us daily, none of the material belongings that he took give us the nightmares we suffer while we

sleep. The nightmares come from the memory of the pain we endured when the rights to our bodies was taken away

We are the victims, we are the survivors and we have brought our stories to you first hand.

Attached is how the indecent treatment of a child has effected that child from her own personal experience and in her own words.

Signed by her.

That child is my daughter, and I can promise you that her abuse the sexual assault in which she suffered has effected out entire family and now over spills into the community we are all traumatised on a much deeper level then what it did when our abuser stole my money and our car.

We live this trauma daily.

My name is [REDACTED]

I am now 16 years old

I reside in a residential care home because my violent outbursts were taking a huge impact on my mum and younger siblings

I am a DFV survivor

I was beaten and raped on a regular basis by abuser

The threats to kill my mother and my siblings and what I now know as coercive control was what my abuser use to keep me silent.

It started late at night when I was almost 7

He came in and at first he seemed caring and just trying to be nice

The kindness soon changed and at the age of 7 instead of being taught how to ride a bike with out training wheels I was taught how to give my abuser oral sex at the time I was told by my older sister whom he also abused that it was normal and how he showed his love

So I thought this was normal despite the fact that I hated it

The abuse got worse the threats were real I asked child safety for help i told them my story Everytime police arrived i told them what he did when he was hitting us I kept the Sexual abuse quiet to scared to speak and to young to be noticed I have a criminal record now at 16 because as I try to navigate through the trauma I can't I can't see the end of the pain right now. My family keep me strong but everyday I wake up trying to do better trying to cope but an anger and a pain burns inside and sometimes it's to big to push down its to big to talk about its to big to stop I have spent the night in the watch house and I'm not scared of it I don't want that for myself but when I rage from pain I don't care about anything or any consequences or any one in the community that this effects, not until after I have raged and then I sleep for days and when I wake I see the damage I have caused because the pain that my abuser caused me won't go away. No amount of time he spends in jail will help because he will be free one day and he will hurt another little girl. He Smashed my phone and he took my belongings if I could exchange them to be un raped I would. My abuser faces less jail time then my stepfather who went through the same abuse as me as a kid, he is [REDACTED] in the stories above. He used drugs and went on a crime spree to support that habit as a victim himself I relate to him, he has never hit my mum, my siblings or me he never raped me or my mum or did any thing like that to any woman or child but his sentence could be longer then what my abuser is sentenced. How and why is this fair ? How do we seek comfort and heal with a justice system so Focused on material possessions over people. He raped me He hurt me I'm a child and should be protected by the law by you. Yet I

am faced with the stark reality that my stepfather who by the laws definition is a thief and a junkie yet he is the best man I know and has gone to great lengths to protect me, my mum and siblings probably won't come home before my abuser is released.

Where is the justice in this world and this is the world I now live in

How do I heal and move forward when material belongings out weigh me as a person as a child as the future of this world? I am taught that my body is worth less than a stolen car...

Tell me I'm worth more because the justice system shows me that I'm not...
